- *Coordinate globally to maintain a consistent and highly usable Internet Numbers Registry system*

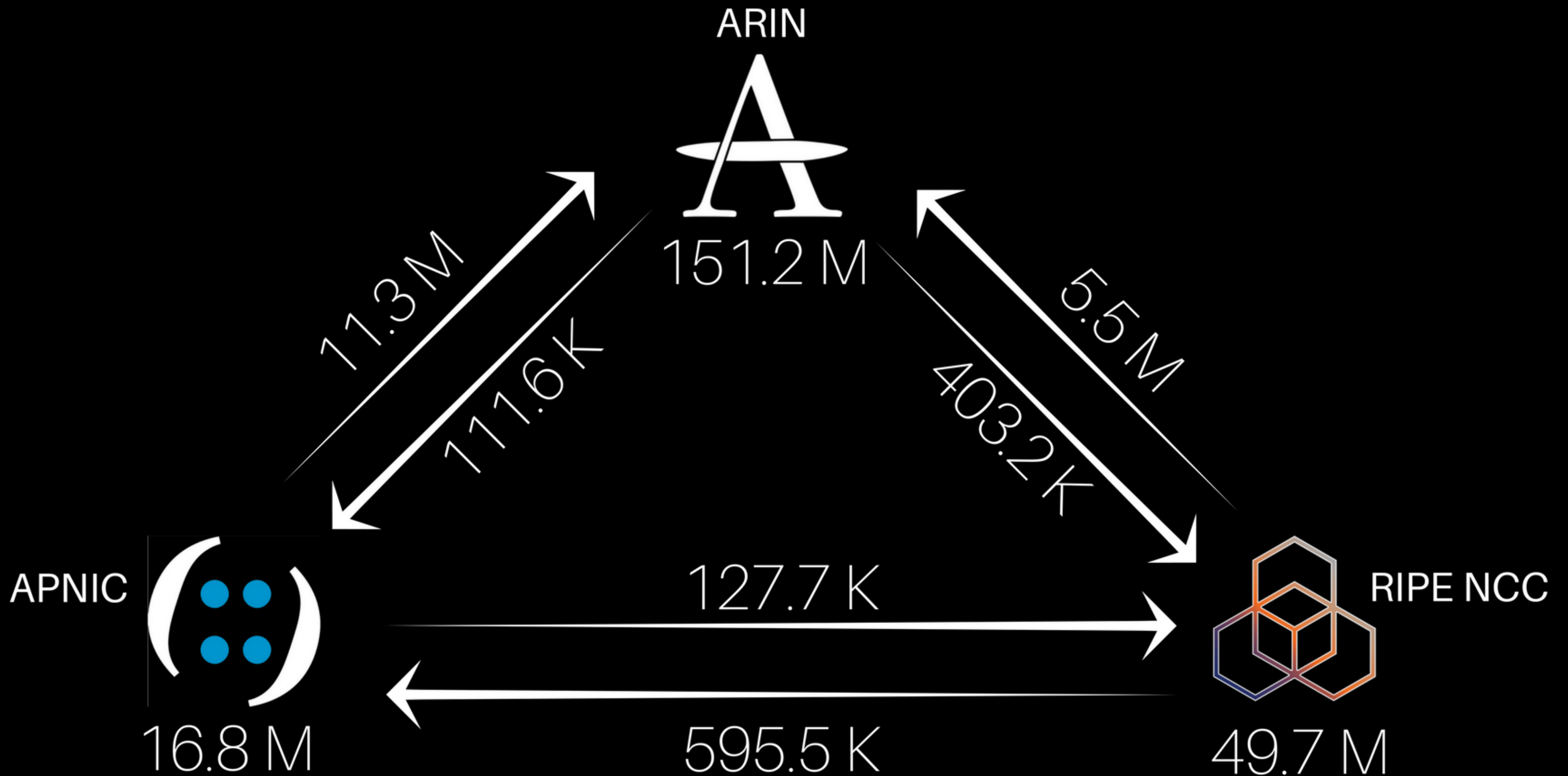

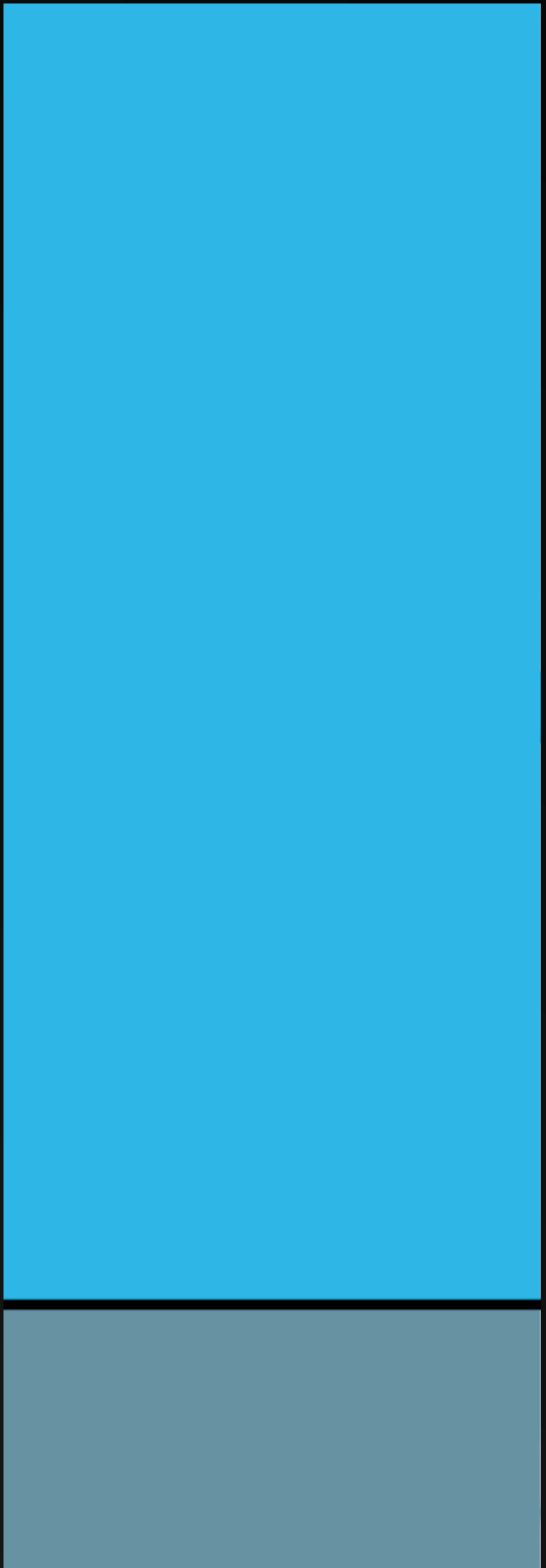
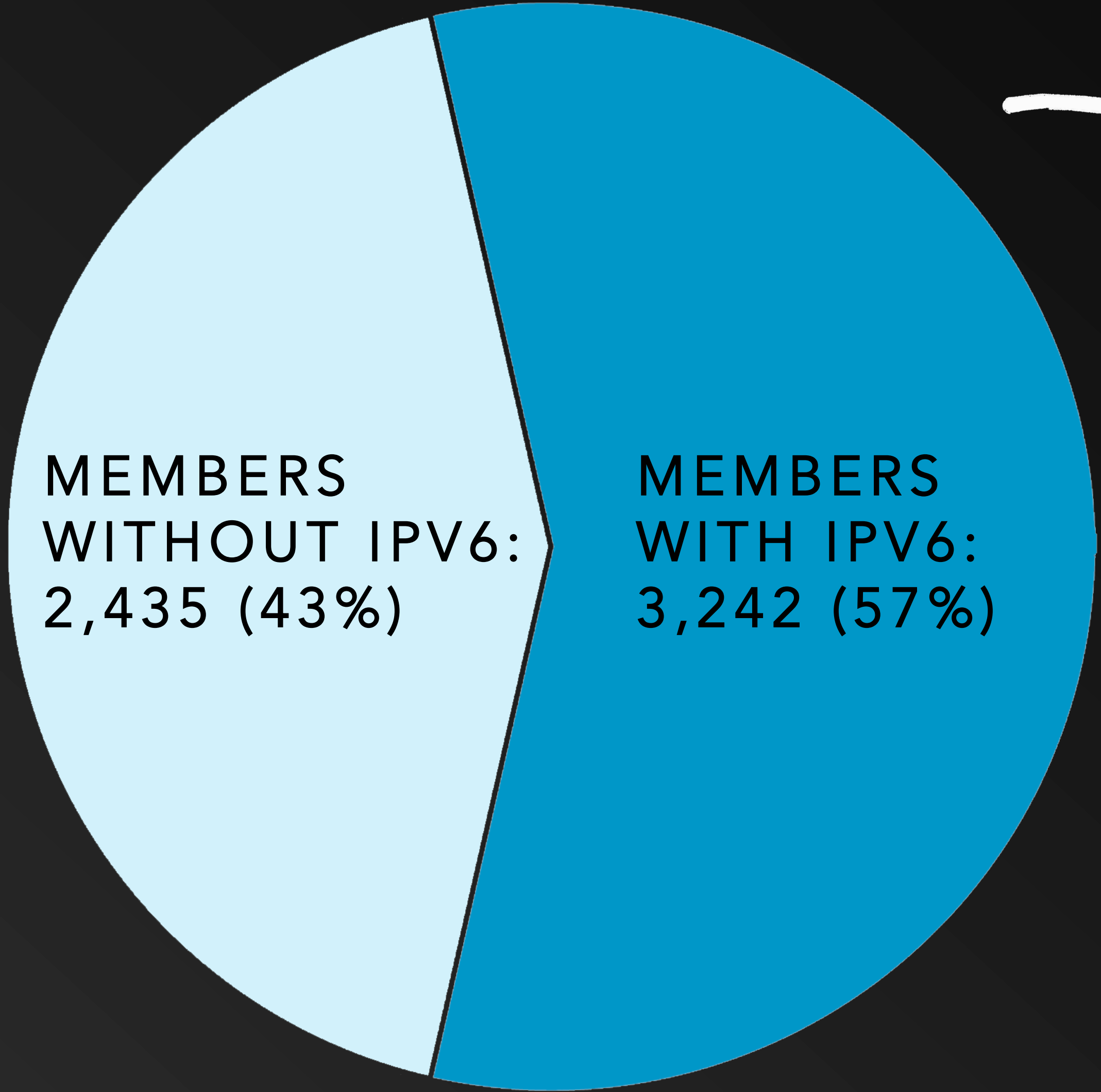
CARIBBEAN ENGAGEMENT
