Tell us about yourself and your interests.

Tell us about your work experience, education and professional development.

I've been working at NIC MX for more than 21 years during which I have been responsible for the operation of domain names and IP addresses, as well as registrar services; more recently, from 2006 to date, I am responsible for strategic planning, service quality, risks for the organization, taking care of our clients' personal data, and leading the innovation and research labs and projects for improving information security in Mexico. I've had the opportunity to teach some courses and offer talks in





different organizations on how IP addresses and domain names are operated and managed. I hold several certifications, among them project manager and process auditor.

Tell us why you are interested in participating in LACNIC and your history with the organization.

I was responsible for assigning IP addresses before the formal creation of the RIRs. My first interaction with an RIR was with ARIN, so the creation of LACNIC represented a change in the way we worked (it became more enjoyable and professional). Knowing that we can also do things well in our region fills me with pride. Over the years, I had the chance to serve several members of my community and understand their needs and concerns. I have witnessed the evolution and growth of our region thanks to an organization such as LACNIC. These are the reasons that motivate me to want to be part of that change and contribute my skills to improve the Internet in Latin America and the Caribbean.

What do you think of LACNIC, its mission, and the organization's role as a driver of growth and development in the region?

I believe LACNIC is the engine driving the region's transformation, that the organization is committed to its members, and that it is part of an open, free, integral, safe and collaborative Internet.
